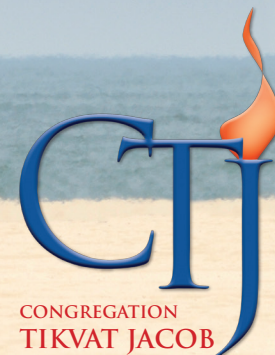

What is a Havurah?

A Havurah is a small group of people who meet regularly to share social, cultural, educational, religious, or community action experiences. The Havurah experience is for people who want to work towards building a unique communal bond – almost an extended family.

What Does a Havurah Do?

Each Havurah decides on its own purpose and activities based on its own needs. One Havurah may plan hikes and camping trips, while another may be interested in movies and theater. While CTJ and its Havurah Coordinators will provide ideas and support for Havurah activities, each Havurah is self-directed.

What is CTJ's Role?

The Havurah Coordinators will help groups to find new members, plan events, and facilitate communications. In addition, the CTJ clergy and education staff will be available to each Havurah for events and discussions. We encourage each group to take advantage of these resources.

How Do I Join?

Complete the Havurah Application Form on the reverse side and return it to CTJ. After reviewing the applications, the Havurah Coordinators will group people according to general needs and interests. You will be invited to an opening session to meet your Havurah and begin planning a calendar, or you may be invited to join an existing Havurah.
