# Rabbi's Reflections

The ingenuity of the Jewish people continues to astound me, especially as we find ourselves at the one-year mark of this pandemic. I am constantly amazed by the incredible ways that Jews and Israel play a continuous role in the creation of cutting edge technologies to help us through this difficult time: Sonovia masks from Israel have a special shield layer that wards off bacteria, viruses, and fungi of all kinds; Tadiran Air Conditioning units use hydrogen peroxide to create safe spaces free of worry of the virus; the CEO of Pfizer and the chief medical officer of Moderna are both proudly Jewish – one is the son of Holocaust survivors and the other an Israeli; and of course, how incredible is it that Israel leads the world in its vaccination effort with more than 30% of the population having received at least one shot.

With all this great news, it looks like things might even get better this spring... while the current vaccines on the market are miraculous, the Jewish people have been working hard to help with this effort and create a vaccine that requires only one shot, no refrigeration, and protects the body immediately from the virus. In addition, this new vaccine which is being developed in conjunction with the Technion and Hadassah Hospital, will also protect from leprosy (the disease described in the book of Leviticus).

The story behind the new vaccine is truly incredible – many of you know that in the 1800's Rabbi Dov Behr Manischewitz opened a small bakery in Cincinnati, OH. After the repeal of prohibition, Manischewitz began making wine using cheap Labrusca grapes from upstate NY. These grapes were rarely used for consumption because of their tough skin and extremely high sugar content. Slowly over time, Manischewitz wine was used not just by the Jewish community but sales actually

peaked during Thanksgiving and Christmas as non-Jews found its sweet taste and inexpensive price appealing.

Fast forward 75 years and the brilliant scientists at the Technion begin doing experiments with Manischewitz as part of a funny video they hoped to post for Passover. Much to their surprise, they could not believe that under a microscope, the sugar molecules from the Labrusca grape had the ability to attach to certain cells and destroy the outer layer – an unbelievable discovery that might change the world, especially a world facing a pandemic.

After years of research and numerous clinical trials, the "Manischewitz vaccine" is in its final stages of approval. With a 90% effective rate (a denomination of 18 of course) and little side effects (a few people have experienced a bit of slurred speech, saying "l'chayim" at the beginning of each sentence, and a desire to eat matzah) the vaccine holds great promise. Just last week I read that the medical journal of Chelm released findings that in early trials patients said that learning Hebrew became much easier after receiving the vaccine.

Since CTJ's leadership and staff are always thinking ahead, we have reached out to Manischewitz and have secured 118 doses of the vaccine when it is ready. The first rollout of the vaccine will be given to Kohanim (those whose lineage goes back to the Temple). We hope to purchase more as they become available. Our CTJ doctors and nurses have agreed to administer the process when they arrive.

I hope that you will rejoice with me and express great pride this season that our tradition continues to pave the way forward to a better and sweeter world. Who knew that the four cups of wine we have been drinking at our seders would one day prove to be lifesaving? This is truly a *shecheyanu* moment!



In the first semester, students in our songwriting chug (elective) explored rhythm, rhyme, and poetry. Throughout the semester they also worked with the Hashkiveinu text from our liturgy:

Hashkiveinu adonai eloheinu l'shalom,[1]
Lay us down to sleep, Adonai our God, in peace, 
v'ha'amideinu malkeinu l'chayim,
raise us erect, our Sovereign to life;
ufros aleinu sukat sh'lomecha,
spread over us the shelter of Your peace.
v'tak'neinu b'eitzah tovah mil'fanecha,
Set us aright with good counsel from before Your
Presence,
v'hoshieinu l'ma'an sh'mecha.

In an echo of the first unit of their core religious school classes this year, they explored the idea of *sukkat shalom* - shelter of peace, from this prayer. They talked about spaces and situations where they feel safe, and where they experience peace. Here are some of their lyrics:






