RABBI'S REFLECTIONS

These are dark days. I am referring to the fact that it gets dark so early. I absolutely hate it. I love the middle of summer when it remains light until almost nine o'clock at night. And yet, there is something about this time of year that screams Hanukkah. There was brilliance in the Rabbis idea to create a holiday that is all about light. After all, Hanukkah was most likely just a delayed celebration of Sukkot in a year where Sukkot couldn't be celebrated because of a war. But, the rabbis had other ideas. They created the famous story about the oil because they knew that this time of year was the darkest and that a lit menorah could bring both physical and spiritual light.

These are also dark days in terms of antisemitism. For those of us who are constantly following the news, it is shocking as to how often there is a story about blatant antisemitism happening in our nation. Besides the Kanyes, Kyries & Daves, a day rarely goes by without a hoffic comment at a school, a city being littered with racist flyers, or a physical altercation on a street corner. Did you know that last year there were 51 antisemitic assaults (physical altercations) in New York alone? This year, once the data is compiled, it will be more than that! The ADL says that the question they have received the most over the past few months is, "Where in the world should we move to to be safe?" And, recently, I was talking with a congregant who said that unfortunately, for the first time in their life, they understand why Israel is so important as a safe haven for the Jewish people.

There is no question that I am greatly concerned about the darkness our people are facing. However, I also know an antidote. Besides a strong State of Israel, a united CTJ community can help dispel the darkness associated with antisemitism. By knowing that together (we are a community of over 1000 people strong), we can definitely be a loud voice against hate. And, by partnering with communities like MBCC, Martyrs and others, our numbers are even greater!

I am so proud of three upcoming events that can help us through these dark days. First, our sixth annual Hanukkah celebration at The Point on Sunday, December 11th from 1 PM – 3 PM is truly a highlight of the year. We usually serve over 500 latkes & doughnuts, hear music from our kids, we will have a magician and a balloon man, enjoy arts and crafts, and so much more. Then, that evening, we are honored to host at CTJ a special screening and panel discussion of the short film "Unsafe Spaces." The producer of the film as well as social media influencers will be with us to talk about the difficulties they have faced as Jews and how they have battled antisemitism. This is a mustsee for all of us, but especially if you have a teen or young adult. We have invited our friends from Temple Shalom to join us.

Finally, I am excited to tell you that on Monday, December 12th, we are hosting an event in conjunction with MB United, MBCC, American Martyrs, and Trinity Lutheran. Paul Small and Josh Freeman, authors of the coffee table book, *A Festival of Light*, will lead the discussion as to how Hanukkah's "eight core human values" apply to all of us during this season. A book signing and refreshments follow the talk.

Together, I have no doubt we will bring a lot of light to this season despite the early sunset times and despite the antisemitism. There is brilliance in that our tradition follows Hillel and adds a light each night to the menorah instead of decreasing the light like the school of Shammai teaches. I hope you will join me at one of our many upcoming events in making this season bright for us all. We can be the light. Wishing you and your loved ones a great Hanukkah and a joyous end to 2022.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

iriam goes to the post office to buy stamps for her holiday cards. She asks the cashier, "May I please have 50 Hanukkah stamps?" The cashier asks, "What denomination?" To which Miriam replies, "Oh vey, has it come to this? OK, give me 6 Orthodox, 12 Conservative, and 32 Reform."

Yes, it's that time of year again, and I'm not referring to Black Friday or Cyber Monday. It's time to dust off the menorah and do some holiday shopping. Beginning at sundown the 25th day of Kislev (Sunday, December 18th in Manhattan Beach), Hanukkah will be showing up in houses all across the world. For eight magicval nights we celebrate the festival of lights, Hanukkah. What better time than now to remind ourselves of the true miracle of Hanukkah and why we celebrate?

Speaking of stamps, what did the stamp say to the Hanukkah card? "Stick with me, and you'll go places."

Hanukkah is a holiday that celebrates the triumph of light over darkness. It commemorates the miracle of the menorah, which burned for eight days on a single day's worth of oil. This is a time for hope and renewal as we reflect on the past year and set intentions for the year to come.

Each night, as we light the next candle in the menorah, we recite two blessings. The first one is a blessing of the candles themselves. The second is a blessing of gratitude for the miracle of deliverance and our faith's unwavering strength of perseverance through challenging times.

On the first night of Hanukkah, we light the Shamash ("helper" in Hebrew) and the first candle. We will also add a third blessing, the Shehecheyanu. This prayer is meant to mark all joyful times in Jewish life, including the rededication of the Temple in Jerusalem.

The first night of Hanukkah is also a time for family and friends to get together. It is a time to celebrate our traditions and remember what is important in our lives. Get ready for delicious latkes, spinning the dreidel, and making precious memories with the ones you love.

Hanukkah is also the perfect time to share our honored traditions with the younger generations in our families as we give thought to what those traditions meant to our younger selves. It's also a time to reflect on the story of Hanukkah, beginning with the Syrian-Greek king Antiochus IV, who ruled over our Jewish ancestors in the Land of Israel. In that time, Jewish people practiced their faith at the ancient Temple in the city of Jerusalem. The Temple marked the center of Jewish life and was considered the holiest of all holy places. In those days, our ancestors celebrated Shabbat and honored the Passover, Sukkot, and Shavuot, just like we do today!

Antiochus was a cruel ruler. He did not want to rule over a nation that was divided into many religions and cultures. So he decided to ban the practice of Judaism, ordering the Jews to worship Greek gods as he did. He demanded that all Jewish people operate according to Greek customs and would not allow them to dress differently, worship differently, or even eat differently.

Under Antiochus's rule, many Jewish customs were forbidden, including the celebration of Shabbat. He outlawed the reading or studying of the Torah. And worst of all, he prevented our Jewish ancestors from worshiping the sacred Temple. Instead, he converted the Temple into an unholy symbol by setting up unfamiliar idols and dedications to Greek gods throughout it.

Our Jewish ancestors were afraid for their lives but unwilling to give up their faith. The Maccabees were a small group of Jewish individuals who decided to reclaim the Temple and protect the Jewish faith against the reign of Antiochus. They bravely stood up for what is right and rebelled against Antiochus and his army. The Syrian-Greek army was much larger, but they lacked the mighty spirit and relentless determination of the Maccabees.

After the Maccabees had won the battle, they returned to the Holy Temple in Jerusalem to find it had been desecrated. They cleansed the Temple and lit the menorah, but there was only enough oil for one day. Miraculously, the menorah burned for eight days.

It's important that we reflect on the history of our faith and find strength in it during these crazy times. With the recent uptick in hatred and anger towards Jews and minority groups, it is essential that we come together as a community and stand up for each other. We must show the world that we are strong and united. Our Jewish faith is something to be proud of, never forget that!

Hanukkah is a holiday that acknowledges miracles and reminds us of just how resilient the Jewish faith can be. It is a time for family, friends, and the community to come together and celebrate the light of freedom and liberty.

I hope you have a warm and happy Hanukkah spent celebrating with the ones you love most.

Remember to keep calm and dreidel on!




