As a kid, one of the first songs I learned at camp was "David Melech Yisrael." Of course, the hand motions were the best part. Recently, I came across a quote by Maimonides, who lived over eight hundred years ago, in relation to my favorite camp song. He teaches the following, "It is important to sing David Melech Yisrael, but we should emphasize the words chai, chai v'kayam much stronger." He goes on to teach that the word chai means not only life but a state of being that is "elevated," similar to the feeling "after an encounter with kaneh bosem – an aromatic cane..." or as we know it, cannabis. I was shocked that Maimonides knew about the effects of cannabis so many years ago!

I also love the connection between the word chai and high... it is as if the English language used the term from Hebrew. I don't think my encounter with this ancient teaching was mere coincidence, since I recently learned that the Conservative Movement of Judaism last month ruled that using cannabis in moderation was permissible and encouraged. As we know, cannabis has incredible medicinal properties and can truly elevate an experience.

After much thought and consideration, I recently brought forward to our leadership the idea of turning our small CTJ gift shop (the windowed cabinets on the left side of the lobby) into a kosher cannabis shop. Kosher


cannabis is a bit harder to find but given that the Jewish community is now encouraged to try it, we thought how wonderful it would be if we could use it at kiddushes, holidays, and other special occasions. I can't help but think of how much fun a long, drawn-out Passover seder could be with a little THC, and how much more comfortable it will be to sit for five hours during Rosh Hashanah services with some CBD helping relieve those back pains.

So far, two of the leading kosher cannabis companies – Mazel Tov Farms and Cali Kosher, both California growers, have signed on to partner with us. We are currently in talks with Chai Teens – carefully crafted cannabis products for teenagers to help make post-Bar/Bat Mitzvah learning and other youth Jewish celebrations wildly joyous. Mr. Myles can't wait to lead our first Happy Shabbat with our youth as they jump from the bimah in a "chai" state of mind.

There are some hurdles we will have to overcome to receive certification as a distributor – Rabbi Kalev must take a test on the Talmudic pages dealing with *ghat* – a psychedelic leaf that many Yemenite Jews would chew while they studied Torah. Cantor Beth needs to make sure she can continue to carry the Torah in her high-soled shoes while under the effects of some of the products. We also need Jules to work with Imahot (our baking group) to find great cannabis desserts that can be served safely at our Onegs.

We have the opportunity to be the second synagogue in the country to offer kosher cannabis (Beit Tsedudlt in Berkeley was the first) – it is an exciting moment for CTJ as we inch closer to our centennial celebration. I look forward to sharing a gummy or brownie with you in the near future. What a blessing it is for your leadership to always try and elevate your Jewish experience here at CTJ.

Why Do We Pull Pranks on Purim?

WONDERING WHAT'S UP WITH THE Purim ISSUE?

The holiday of Purim is known for the Hebrew expression "nahafochu" meaning "to be turned on its head."

The days surrounding Purim are known as *yamei mishteh v'simcha* - the days of revelry and merrymaking. Most likely, because drinking on Purim is considered a "mitzvah" so that you don't know the difference between the characters of the story, it probably then led to jokes, pranks, etc. There are quite a few conversations in the code of Jewish law as to what is appropriate and what is not... can you dress like the opposite sex, can you steal something, etc. Even in the times of the Talmud (500) they were telling Purim stories that were so crazy people knew they couldn't be true. So, I think it is all part of the "fun" of the holidays - when so often we are told we have to behave a certain way, etc... this is just the opposite.


