

#### PODCASTS IN SPRINGTIME

he pace in which the world changes is truly incredible. When I was in rabbinical school (May will be my 20th anniversary since ordination), one of the first things they taught you was that you always had to be reading something so, when a congregant asked you, you could share the latest book you were enjoying. Today, I am rarely asked what I am reading but rather, "Rabbi, what are you listening to?" As we start to wind down the synagogue year and get ready for summer, I thought I would share with you what I am listening to in case you too want something new in your podcast list.

In order of favorites:

**#1 – Unholy: Two Jews On the News** – I actually wait all week for this podcast to come out, I love it that much. Sponsored by one of Israel's main broadcasting companies, Keshet, author and journalist Jonathan Freedland from London and journalist Yonit Levi from Tel Aviv share their thoughts on the Jewish world and Israel and interview some incredible guests. Jonathan is brilliant, but it is really Yonit who always blows me away with her insights and sense of humor – no wonder she is one of Israel's most decorated TV anchors.

#2 - Gatecrashers - I randomly fell upon this unbelievably engaging series from Tablet Magazine about the Jewish experience at Ivy League schools. It contains incredible stories that will make you cry, smile, and make you feel proud as to the Jewish contribution in shaping the American university experience. The eight-part series is narrated by the host of another one of my favorite podcasts (see #3), the engaging Mark Oppenheimer.

#3 - Unorthodox - This fun podcast from Tablet magazine is led by three great hosts - Mark Oppenheimer, Liel Liebovitz, and Stephanie Butnick all who have very different backgrounds and connections to Judaism (unfortunately, Mark is leaving the show at the end of April). They are smart, funny, and very engaging and always seem to have a unique take on the Jewish world. I love their "News of the Jews" session as well as when they interview a non-Jew of the week. It's lots of fun.

#4 - Identity Crisis - This is a deeply meaningful, weekly podcast from our friends at The Shalom Hartman Institute in Jerusalem led by Yehudah Kurtzer. I sometimes have to listen to this podcast twice because it can be quite deep and academic, but Yehudah is a brilliant mind and I love his and his quests' take on current trends in the Jewish world and how we can think about these issues in a different way. He tackles everything from Israel to synagogue life to American Judaism and so much more!

#5 - For Heaven's Sake - Another amazing weekly podcast from The Shalom Hartman Institute but this time led by three scholars – Donniel Hartman, Yossi Klein Halevi, and Elana Stein Hain. Donniel & Yossi start the podcast off debating issues taking place in Israel today and Elana comes in at the end to add a Jewish text that relates to the issue discussed. The three hosts bring a much-needed perspective to the roller coaster ride of Israel's ever changing government and situation and I always end the podcast feeling as though I learned something substantial.

So, that is the first five on my list. I know what you are thinking... "Rabbi, it is okay to leave the Jewish world and listen to something that isn't related to Judaism and Israel." I do listen to other podcasts and try to keep up with the current world, but my soul is truly filled when I learn more about our amazing tradition and so, I spend most of my time listening to Jewish podcasts.

s we wrap up this school year at the OEC, students continue to delve into Jewish holidays, hands-on art and cooking activities, learning Hebrew, community engagement, their chosen chugim (electives), and, for our 7th grade students, Holocaust education including a meaningful trip to the Museum of Tolerance.

For Passover, students were given a "blank" seder plate with clues that directed them around the synagogue to eight different

locations - 6 for every item on the seder plate, 2 for matzah and wine - to gather all 8 items and complete their seder plates! The hunt included an egg pass, wine making, spicy hot sauce tasting, charoset making, and short skits to retell the story of Passover! Students became more connected to the holiday and the meanings behind the ritual items on the seder plate/table. All grades also got to experience making matzah from scratch - all in under 18 minutes to keep it Kosher!

Our 3rd-7th graders had a fabulous time on Retreat - visiting Camp JCA for a day of learning about some of our Jewish core values and lots of fun and adventure. We sang songs, learned how to make apple juice and charoset using a bike blender, took a wonderful hike, and climbed the rock wall. Students love this time outside of class to bond and step out of their comfort zones!

OEC spent the year learning together, making new friends, eating together and of course having lots of fun together. I have enjoyed spending this year with all the OEC students; it has truly been a special year. I know that next year will be amazing with Rachel Hershman as Director of Education.

Thank you to our teachers!!! Thank you for caring about your students. Thank you for sharing your knowledge and your lives with us. Thank you for showing patience, understanding, and flexibility. Thank you for creating a climate of calm for students to study, learn, and grow. Thank you for






